COVID-19 Task Force Report	<ul> <li>Meredith Kimbell shared five recommendations from the COVID-19 Taskforce for adoption by the Board.</li> <li>The Board passed the following guidelines:</li> <li>Via email, prior to this meeting, the Board approved the following: CHMS can allow small groups of masked children to wait briefly for drop off or pick up at 8-9 am, 12:30 pm, 3 pm and 4:50 pm in the West Foyer while following existing guidelines as long as UUCR staff are notified and approve.</li> <li>While the building is otherwise closed, during Hybrid Worship, only those people directly involved with presenting or producing the service will be allowed in the sanctuary. All will be fully vaccinated, distanced and masked when indoors except when actively presenting.</li> <li>The Board approved the purchase of 6 portable air purifiers plus 1 set of replacement filters for each.</li> </ul>

	socially distance by at least 6 feet.
	<ul> <li>Individuals working with RE children must show</li> </ul>
	proof of vaccination to reduce risk to all.
	<ul> <li>The UUCR Board requires that all entering the</li> </ul>
	building be fully vaccinated against Covid-19, except
	for those with a medical exemption. This is the best
	way to reduce risk for everyone.
	<ul> <li>Board approves holding occasional indoor</li> </ul>
	rehearsals/recording sessions with a soloist or up to
	4 fully vaccinated singers from the same household,
	masked, 6 feet apart, 30-minute limit, and ideally
	with 2 portable filters running (except for
	immediate recording period.)
	<ul> <li>Occasional outdoor rehearsals/recording sessions</li> </ul>
	with the choir are approved under the following
	conditions: all attendees are fully vaccinated (proof
	required), 6 feet apart, and masked. The session
	must be 50 minutes or under.
	The Board appreciated the hard work and dedication of

Treasurer's Report	Kathy Deligianis explained that the FY 2020 deficit
	was \$16,000 which was covered by savings. There
	was hope that the deficit would be less but there
	were outstanding pledges.

HVAC Update	<ul> <li>Jesse Fortner shared details of the August 20<sup>th</sup> Leadership Council meeting:         <ul> <li>Hybrid Worship setup is complete. Training is this Saturday, 8/28/21 for 3 hours.</li> <li>The HVAC team reached out to 3 designers, and 2 agreed to review and offer proposals. They will have a decision in 2 weeks on whether to use a company or consult a designer.</li> <li>The UU Church of Fredrick also recent underwent an overhaul and members are getting information from their committee.</li> <li>The taskforce is also evaluating the options for window replacement. There are supply chain and vendor delay issues.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
